Join us on a bike ride to find the answers to these questions.

The bike route will visit several historical places in Gahanna, including the Shull Log House and Clark Home near Friendship Park.

The distance is 6 miles on the Big Walnut Trail and on-street bike routes. For those interested, we will ride an additional 17 miles to locations in Jefferson Township – The Old Bush Homestead and Monteí Indian mound.

The ride is free of charge; voluntary donations to the Gahanna Historical Society will be accepted.

Ride starts promptly at 1PM. We'll have a snack at the Shull Log House.

A parent or guardian must attend with children under age 18 or sign a permission release.
